MY BACKGROUND: previous training and professional experience

After a general baccalaureate, I didn't know what I wanted to study. I had an aptitude for science, physics and maths, but I didn't have a career in mind. Thanks to what he had to say, I learned about a number of jobs that I didn't know about and that could be a good fit for me. So I decided to go into the industrial sector.

I took a DUT in QLIO (Quality, Industrial Logistics and Organization) at the IUT in Annecy, then did a work-study course in mechanical production engineering, specializing in industrial engineering, at ITII Savoie.

During this training, I did a 3-year work-study program in a non-profit organization that employs disabled people. I held the position of continuous improvement project manager. This first professional experience enabled me to gain skills in project management and understand how a company works.

I then held the position of production team leader and continuous improvement engineer at Amphenol Socapex for 3 years. This position gave me experience of team management, production management and working in the field.

I'm an industrialization and methods project manager at Amphenol Socapex. My main mission is to manage the entire project process. I establish the various manufacturing stages, the budget, the areas for improvement, coordinate and train the teams and ensure that the project is completed successfully.

Human and technical resources are needed to make each project a success. I'm currently working on a strategic and structuring project: the transfer of certain production lines to our new site in Tunisia.

I like this job because it's very stimulating and allows me to tackle a variety of tasks, both on the production support side and in the field.
